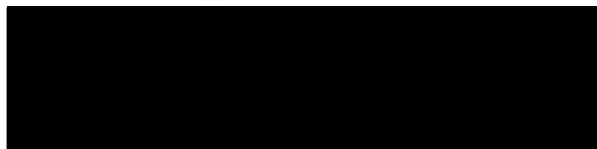
Dear Mr. Pulley:

## Declaration of Mary S Nease

I, Mary S Nease, hereby declare as follows:

1. I am the CHRO and Senior Vice President, Shared Services and am responsible for Human Resources of Minnesota Public Radio, the licensee of Station KNWF - FM, which is part of a station employment unit based in Fergus Falls, Minnesota and which includes KNWF-FM and KCMF-FM (the "Fergus Falls SEU"). Both stations in this SEU are both licensed to Minnesota Public Radio. This Statement is being submitted in response to the April 19, 2010 letter of Lewis Pulley, Assistant Chief of the Policy Division of the Commission's Media Bureau concerning a random audit of the station's EEO compliance (the "EEO Audit Letter").

1. This SEU employs fewer than five full-time employees as the term is defined in the Commission's broadcast EEO rule, 47 C.F.R. § 73.2080(e)(1). Neither station in this SEU has any full-time employees.

2. In response to Question 3(d) of the EEO Audit Letter, the license affirms that it is not aware of any discrimination complaints filed against either of the stations in this SEU during the current license term.
