

5 Seats Away From Extinction...



If the House Republicans lose five seats this November, the few remaining members of the House Republicans will be no more than empty carcasses.

The Republicans in the State Senate are so small in number that they cannot sustain a veto. The Senate is not on the ballot this year, which means only the Republicans in the House of Representatives can stop vetoes from being overridden! If we lose five seats, the chance of maintaining a veto ever again under our Governor is done, finished, extinct!

We are a mere five seats away from being completely irrelevant!

You all have heard about the six Republicans that voted with the Democrats to override the transportation veto. We should all be angry about a bridge going down. We have heard your voices. We all agree that our infrastructure, roads and bridges need public funding.

However, this is what you may not know. The House Republican plan would have dedicated \$450 million without raising taxes. The DFL Transportation bill that passed dedicates only \$60 million to roads and bridges. Instead of addressing fundamental infrastructure needs, the DFL opted to waste even more of your money on light rail boondoggles.

There is a clear and present danger in this purple state we call home and it is the possibility of a DFL controlled House and Senate that can override every veto by Governor Pawlenty. If that happens, we may as well be extinct.

That's over \$675,000 collectively. You and I hear on the news all the time how the Republicans are the recipients of special interest money. Our seven top PAC and Lobbyists totaled only \$144,638. With these kinds of odds, extinction may be a real possibility this election cycle.

Again, we believe the people of Minnesota deserve better. This election needs to be about change... but a common sense, conservative change. If we stick to our core Republican principles, we can win in November!. We are targeting 24 House seats and in order to win these seats back, it will require a minimum of \$100,000 per race.

Why 24 seats?

Did you know that out of 2.2 million votes cast in the last election in Minnesota, the House Republicans lost 24 seats by less than 8,800 votes state-wide?

24 seats will put us back in the majority.
