To the Directors of  
Liberty Choruses and Community Singing.

We find that the influenza epidemic throughout the state is still quite severe in many localities; in others it has subsided somewhat.

We have deemed it unwise to attempt anything definite in the way of a state wide community sing on account of it. However, the work of the organization should be so far advanced in your territory at this time as to enable you to give the Commission of Public Safety a report as to the extent you have prepared for active work or are at present engaged in active community events.

The Commission of Public Safety is preparing a certificate to be awarded to those Liberty Choruses and their directors who can show results in their organization work. Will you kindly advise us whether your Chorus is ready to receive this recognition of completed organization and give us the full title that you have adopted for the same, also your full name as director. On receipt of this information we will send you the certificate.

We wish to advise that slides for use in theatres can be had from the War Camp Community Service, 1 Madison Ave., New York City.

Song sheets will be sent you on request in case you need an additional supply.
