1. Voted Against Funds that May Have Prevented Bridge Collapse

Emmer voted three times against funds that would have repaired broken infrastructure across Minnesota, including the I-35 bridge. 2. Opposed Bill to Compensate Bridge Collapse Victims

3. Voted Against Infrastructure Improvements After Bridge Collapsed
